The Research Officer is responsible for conducting research and implementing cocoa cultivation, production, sustainability projects and cocoa predictions. He/she conducts field trials, analyses data, and collaborates with various stakeholders to enhance cocoa farming practices, improve yield, and ensure sustainable growth and availability for production.

- Organize and conduct field trials with the Cocoa Health & Extension Division (CHED, Cocobod) to evaluate new cultivation techniques and agrochemicals.
- Collaborate with Agricultural programs lead, farmer training and organic officers to identify research priorities and objectives.
